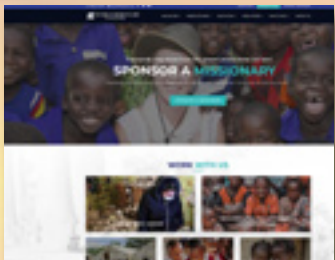

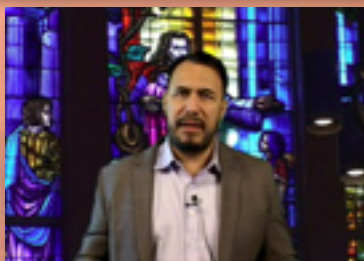

## Child Sponsorship

Imagine being a child who is hungry, alone, and searching through trash for food. You never remember a moment when you weren't hungry. To the world you seem invisible or are a target of scorn. Some ignore you, treat you as if you aren't there, while others curse you and see you as if you are little more than a stray dog.

World Missionary Evangelism began because our founder saw the needs of children who were on the edge between life and death and stepped in to save them. If you can pledge just \$35 a



month, a bit more than a dollar a day, you will build a bridge from hopelessness to hope, from insecurity to security, from being unwanted to being treasured for a hungry, forgotten child. Your gift helps up supply that child with food, clothing, medical care, and an education. Essentially, your \$35 a month sponsorship is not just saving a life, but building a bridge to the future.

## 6 *Native Missionary Sponsorship*

For more than sixty-five years WME has proven the best way to expand this Gospel outreach is to identify and educate local men and women who have been called to share their faith. To support these Native Missionaries we began sponsorship programs.

Over the decades thousands of these missionaries have made a dramatic impact in their communities and have often faced persecution as they shared their faith. Even in 2025, it takes great courage to speak of Jesus in many developing nations.

You can be a Gospel partner in spreading the Good News for just \$40 a month. This partnership enhances a missionary's ability to reach more lost souls and create more Christian impact in their communities. This sponsorship also helps our married missionaries to better support their families.

## *New Needs In Mexico* <sup>7</sup>

Almost two years ago, a team from World Missionary Evangelism, made a trip to a remote region of Mexico to establish a new work in one of the poorest areas of North America. Those we visited are members of a tribe that has called this area home for hundreds of years. They have little access to fresh water, and their children have few opportunities for education.

Since our visit we have established a Food For Hunger Outreach. A gift of any amount can help us feed a child. If you were to pledge a monthly donation of \$25, \$50, or \$100, it would enhance our ability to feed starving families.



To make our outreach more effective, we need to purchase a four-wheel drive vehicle. This truck or van would enable us to transport food, supplies, and missionaries into this remote mountainous region. A gift of \$26,000 would purchase a dependable used truck.

The people we are serving have asked us to help them finish a church building. The cost of completing the interior and furnishings for this structure, which could serve as a learning and child care center as well as a community meeting facility, is \$5,200.

## *Churches in Eastern Europe*

For decades our team in Romania has worked in small communities to spread the Gospel, and their preaching and teaching have made an incredible impact. As new Christians rushed to be baptized, churches were started, and membership grew by leaps and bounds. Right now, in Romania, scores of new churches are meeting in small homes. In many cases, homes are so filled with believers, people are spilling out of doors and listening from porches. So there is no room for visitors.



Due to this growth, we are involved in church building programs. There are eager congregations waiting for a church of their own. Helping provide these Christians with a new church would be a wonderful project for a family, church, Bible study group, Sunday school class, or a business.

## *Feeding The Poor in Sri Lanka*<sup>9</sup>

The mission in Sri Lanka is all encompassing in its scope and spirit. Native Missionaries, staff, and volunteers work as a team to educate children, support a girl's Children's Home, drill wells, develop a new generation of Christian leaders through youth institutions, build churches, and feed the hungry. This work is a beacon of light in a dark world that has inspired Christians around the globe.

One of the areas that has saved lives and opened the door for sharing the faith is the team's feeding program in the slums of the capitol city of

Colombo. This mission touches people of all ages but has been particularly important for children. Through Food for Hunger thousands have been impacted, but due to a downturn in the country's economy, many are still starving in the slums.

## *Water Projects in the Philippines*

Coong, a remote community in the Philippines, is home to around 100 families belonging to the T'boli tribe. The area is blessed with abundant natural water sources but the people need a reservoir to have access to safe and reliable drinking water. With this system in place, families could enjoy

safe drinking water right at their doorstep. The cost is \$3,000.

Datal Baal is a remote community where 30 families live. These people are resilient and hard working, but one of their greatest struggles is access

to clean and safe water. At present, residents must walk miles to fetch water from a spring. This is an exhausting and time-consuming daily task for women and children.

With a properly constructed water system, families will have access to safe drinking water close to their homes. This project will not only provide convenience but will also promote better health, reduce water-borne illnesses, and give children more time for school instead of making long walks to obtain water. Supplying this need to bring clean, safe, and accessible water right to their doorstep of these poor people cost \$3000.

## Churches in the Philippines <sup>11</sup>

Hope Church was established three years ago in a makeshift building. Through the leadership of Pastor Gabriel they have continued to grow. From the small contributions of the congregation, they were able to begin construction. The cost to finish this church is \$2000.

Church of the Risen Lord in General Santos City is a growing congregation whose members are passionate in serving the Lord.

This church building is used almost every day of the week as an education center for native missionaries, hosting youth camps, conducting training sessions, staging music presentations, and even hosting childcare programs. Right now the churches wooden elements are rotting. To fix this issue we plan on constructing a new concrete foundation, with tiled floors, and PVC wall panels. The cost to finish the work for this large church is \$5000.

## 12 *The Dump Mission in Nicaragua*

In Nicaragua, WME has been reaching the people who live within walking distance of the nation's largest garbage pit. As this ministry goes back more than a decade, we know these people well. In spite of living in horrible conditions, they are outgoing, friendly, and giving. What little they have they freely share with others.

Their days begin at first light spending hours sifting through trash finding things they can either use or sell. This is hard work under an unforgiving sun. The odor is overwhelming. They fight rats, snakes, and other vermin as they toil. But in a nation that is one of the poorest on earth, this is the only way they have to feed their families.

## Widows & Orphans in Romania 13

In Romania a part of our work focuses on orphaned children and impoverished elderly women.

At Cornesti there is a state-run orphanage for children whose parents are suffering from tuberculosis.

Government resources are limited, and what is provided barely meets the children's most basic needs. So, our representatives deliver toys, fruit, towels, shoes, socks, underwear, and other clothing.



In Stefanesti, Romania, the frail and elderly are living in a nursing home that lacks both staff and support. These gentle and loving people have been forgotten by almost everyone. To these seniors we distribute winter clothing, blankets, mattresses, and food. These gifts save lives.

Much like those in orphanages and nursing homes, there are widows who the world ignores. These women remain in their small homes and live on government assistance of \$100 or less per month. Our team provides food and clothing and during the long winters helps supply wood that is necessary to keep homes warm.

## 14 *Enslaved Children in Pakistan*

In Pakistan, abjectly poor children and young people, at their lowest point in life, were approached by men who promised food and clothing. The catch, the only way to pay back the debt is to work in a brick kiln factory. The wages for this intense labor are never enough to cover the amount owed. So, each day, toiling in the sweltering heat, these poor souls fall deeper into a trap from which there is no escape.

These children and young people work twelve hours a day, seven days a week, in temperatures climbing to 118 degrees making

bricks. After working shifts in the factory, the girls are often sexually abused.

We have joined a Christian charity working to help these children. Once free, the children, most of whom are true orphans, are placed in either a girls or boys orphanage.

## *Food and Bibles in Pakistan* <sup>15</sup>

The children we are helping to escape slavery in Pakistan need school supplies for the education centers that have been started in both

the Children's Homes. There are sixty children, and the cost is \$25 per child. We also need to purchase Children's Bibles printed in the Urdu language which is what these people speak and read. These would be distributed at the factory and the orphanages. The cost is \$15.

In the meantime, we need gifts of \$25 or more to help with Food For

Hunger missions to feed those still working at the brick factory. These children do not get enough to eat at the factory and Food For Hunger meals might be the only thing that can help keep them alive.

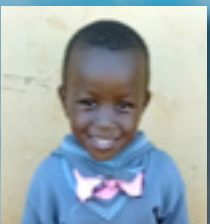
Touching A Life Everyday Of The Year!
